I thank God for His Healing Touch

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As stated in the title of this little booklet, I thank God for His healing touch and because I feel indebted to my Creator, Sustainer, and Saviour for His love, mercy, and grace I think the least I can do is put pen to paper to tell of His amazing ability.

Although many of you may know me, some may not, so before I tell you of my experience of pain and healing let me give you a few details about myself.

I am married to Eric and I am proud to say I am the mother of eight great individuals and the grandmother of seven wonderful grandchildren. We live on the family farm, and our home overlooks beautiful Mulroy Bay, in what I classify as one of the most scenic areas of beautiful County Donegal.

Although farming was our life-time occupation, Eric and I also did door to door sales around our locality with fruit, vegetables, home baking, etc., four days each week for several years. Eric also had a lorry and he transported sheep for us and other farmers from quite a wide catchment area to a factory in Co. Roscommon. He did this twice a week until our son David was able to assist, so life was never dull.

For the past 18 years we have also been involved with a Network Marketing Company that grow and produce Natural Health Products and we believe they have contributed to our general good health.

Because my parents were Christians they took my brother and I to Gospel Meetings from childhood. I believed in God and knew about the Lord Jesus, but it wasn't until I was 15 years of age that I realized I was a sinner and I could never be accepted by God unless I repented of my sin and put my trust in his Son, the Lord Jesus who gave His sinless life for me on the cross at Calvary.

I have written my testimony of how I not only received spiritual healing but I am also thankful to be able to say I received physical healing on two previous occasions. These testimonies I have recorded in a little book called *The Jigsaw Puzzle*.

The thoughts that were in my mind a few days before I suffered what I can only describe as excruciating pain in August 2016 are recorded in the poem "The prayer of my heart." It was when I reread this poem after I again received what I classify as God's healing touch I realized as on

previous occasions God had me where He wanted me to be so that He could speak to me of His foreknowledge, wisdom, love and grace.

I believe God allows us to experience times of difficulty, testing, sickness and pain so that He can lead us into a deeper relationship with Him through faith and trust.

The prayer of my heart

Dear Lord, please lead, guide and direct me In everything I say, think and do Help me to give praise, honour, and glory In every circumstance dear Lord to You!

Thank You for Your blessed Holy Spirit That comforts, strengthens, and keeps Help me to dwell in Your Divine Will Every day whether awake or asleep!

Please, oh please dear Lord, help people to see _ What you want them to know through thoughts you give me Help me to understand Your Word as I read So that I can help others who are in spiritual need.

As I meet people who need you on earth's pathway Take from me anything that would hinder or hurt The people I meet whom you love so much.

Take from me arrogance, hypocrisy, and pride And anything else that should not dwell inside Please show me clearly how you see me And enable me to live as I ought daily.

Take from me thoughtlessness and selfishness I pray Help me to show your love to all who pass my way Lord, I desire naught but to dwell in Your Will May Your Holy Spirit enable me Your Will to fulfil! Because of heavy lifting and eight pregnancies I had to have two operations in recent years. I had a Hysterectomy and I had my pelvic floor tightened but I am very thankful that for a 69 year old, I have very good health and I contribute my good health to Almighty God and the great natural products we use. However, I got a surprise when making a bed one day last August. As I turned slightly to my right to lift a sheet; I was hit with severe pain in my back. The pain went into my leg; to my groin, to the right of my thigh and to the inside of my leg below my knee. I had what I could only describe as excruciating pain both day and night for several weeks. I was only able to sleep about two or three hours each night.

In fact, because the pain was so severe I travelled over thirty kilometres during the night on two occasions to visit Now-Doc in Letterkenny. Although I had given birth to eight children and had had two operations I never felt pain like it. I'm not a very emotional person but I could do nothing but sob. The first painkilling patches and tablets I was given took little effect but when I was prescribed stronger painkillers and patches I was a lot more comfortable.

I had an x-ray done but it didn't reveal the problem and I was told that I would need to have an MRI Scan but I would have to wait a long time to have it done through the system but if I wished I could have it done in the private hospital in Ballykelly, Co Derry.

Because the pain was so severe Eric and I felt we had no option. The MRI was done at the beginning of September and showed that I had bulging discs in my spine; they were touching my spinal cord and had trapped the sciatic nerve. It was thought I would need surgery.

During this time I was questioning God because Eric had prayed and asked God to heal me but I was still in agony and I believed God had the ability to do anything He wished. I knew He had the power to heal because I had experienced His healing touch in the past.

You can now read for yourself the thoughts that were in my head at the time as I believe God began to reveal His purpose.

God has a Purpose and Plan

I began to understand and sympathize With people who live with pain When excruciating was the word I was heard to say over and over again. Pain made me feel so helpless It made me feel so weak When painkillers acted like sweets I could neither, sit, stand, walk or sleep. When my mind began to frazzle And all I wanted to do was cry I gave thanks for family and friends Who sympathised and tried To do all they could to help As painful hours and days went by I could see they too felt helpless This too made me want to cry

Then I began to count my blessings And thank God for family and friends Many offering to bring my needs To the only One who can make amends For their prayers, I was so thankful Because at times I found it hard to pray At other times I questioned God As to why He left me feeling this way You see I had asked for healing Because I had known His healing before But I felt He wanted to teach me much So I could empathize and help people more If I myself experienced What many people have to bear Then I could understand their pain Their burdens, needs, and cares.

One night when in distress
God led me to read Psalm 77
It was as if I were the scribe
And God knew my needs in heaven
He led me to continue reading
To Psalm number 86
When in awe I was able to thank God
As I read my thoughts in His sacred text
I now felt He had a purpose

And I believed He had a plan All I needed to do was trust Him Who hold this world in His Hands!

When I couldn't sleep at night I would get up and either do some reading or writing. One night I opened the Bible and began to read at Psalm 76, nothing really spoke to me within this Psalm, but when I began to read Psalm 77, it was as if the thoughts of my mind and the feelings of my heart were poured out on paper. I continued reading until I reached Psalm 86 and again it was as if my thoughts had been put in print.

As you read Ps. 77 I trust you will understand what I mean.

Psalm 77: 1-15

- 1. I cried out to God for help; I cried out to God to hear me.
- 2. When I was in distress, I sought the Lord; at night I stretched out untiring hands and my soul refused to be comforted.
- 3. I remembered you, O God, and I mused, and my spirit grew faint.
- 4. You kept my eyes from closing; I was too troubled to speak.
- 5. I thought about the former days, the years of long ago;
- 6. I remembered my songs in the night. My heart mused and my spirit enquired;
- 7. "Will the Lord reject for ever? Will he never show his favour again?
- 8. Has his unfailing love vanished for ever? Has his promise failed for all time?
- 9. Has God forgotten to be merciful? Has he in anger withheld his compassion."
- 10. Then I thought, "To this I will appeal; the years of the right hand of the Most High."
- 11. I will remember the years of the Lord; yes, I will remember your miracles of long ago.
- 12. I will meditate on all your works and consider all your mighty deeds.
- 13. Your ways, O God, are holy. What god is so great as our God?
- 14. You are the God who performs miracles; you display your power among the peoples.
- 15. With your mighty arm you redeemed your people, the descendants of Jacob and Joseph.

As you know I was questioning God when I read Psalm 77 and I now said to him, "Lord, the person who wrote this Psalm was also pouring out their heart to you, they must have been in a similar situation to me and if what I am experiencing is in Your Will, then May Your Will be done."

Other people whose life stories are recorded in God's Word then came to mind, people like Joseph, Shadrach, Meshach, Abednego, Daniel, Peter, and Paul.

Joseph: Joseph, a native of Cannon (now called Israel) was sold into slavery by his brothers because of jealousy and he was later falsely accused and sent to prison, but in time God delivered him and gave him a position of authority in Egypt. God had him where he wanted him to be so he would be a blessing to his family in their time of serious need. Genesis chapters 37- 45

Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego: They were thrown into a fiery furnace because they refused to bow down and worship the golden image of King Nebuchadnezzar, but because they declared their faith in God and in his ability to save them God brought them out of the furnace unharmed in any way.

Daniel chapter's 1 - 3

Daniel: During the reign of the Babylonians in Judah, the administrators and governors under King Darius were jealous of Daniel and in order to trap Daniel they asked the King to make a law that anyone who prayed to any god or man other than the King should be thrown into the lions den. Because Daniel refused to pray to King Darius he was thrown into the den, but God brought him out unscathed. As a result King Darius put his trust in Daniel's God and made a decree that the people in his kingdom should fear and revere the God who Daniel served. Daniel chapters 1-6

I thought of how the Lord Jesus, God's own Son allowed His sinless blood to be shed on the cross at Calvary so that we sinners could be saved from all our sins and I remembered how God brought Jesus to the point where He was willing to say, "My Father, if it is possible, may this cup be taken from me. Yet not as I will, but as you will."

As these thoughts came to mind, I remember saying, "Lord, I know that you are the God who is able to do anything you wish."

Sometimes we question God's Purpose and Plan

God recorded events in Scripture
That He wants us to read and heed
We may think they have little relevance
To our physical or spiritual needs!

Scripture tells of Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego
Who disobeyed the laws of the king
Who demanded they ate food offered to idols
Then bow down and worship him.

They disobeyed and were thrown in a furnace,
They chose to obey God rather than man
But God honoured their faith and trust in Him
He delivered them unscathed and unharmed.

Daniel, he was thrown into the lions den
When he also disobeyed the king
Now the king bowed down and worshiped God
when Daniel too walked out unscathed, "redeemed."

Daniel who prayed three times each day
Was honoured by his Lord and God
His life was a testimony to this pagan ruler
Who now commanded, "Worship Daniel's God?"

Sometimes we question God's purpose and plan When as God's servants we trust and obey But like Shadrach, Meshach, Abednego and Daniel We need to trust God who won't lead us astray.

God could have led his servants by an easier route But that was not His purpose and plan He who alone knows the end from the beginning Would in time reveal His purpose to man.

Would King Darius have taken heed?

If God had led His servant Daniel by an easier way
Possibly not, nor would He have ordered His subject
To obey God for the rest of their days!

When I read Psalm 86 it was as if the pen was in my own hand.

Psalm 86:1 - 13

- 1 Hear, O Lord and answer me, for I am poor and needy.
- 2 Guard my life, for I am devoted to you. You are my God; save me your servant who trusts in you.
- 3 Have mercy on me, O Lord, for I call to you all day long.
- 4 Bring joy to your servant, for to you O Lord, I lift up my soul.
- 5 You are forgiving and good, O Lord, abounding in love to all who call to you.
- 6 Hear my prayer, O Lord; listen to my cry for mercy.
- 7 In the day of my trouble I will call to you, for you will answer me.
- 8 Among the gods there is none like you, O Lord; no deeds can compare with yours.
- 9 All the nations you have made will come and worship before you, O Lord; they will bring glory to your name.
- 10 For you are great and do marvellous deeds; you alone are God.
- 11 Teach me your ways, O Lord, and I will walk in your truth; give me an undivided heart, that I may fear your name.
- 12 I will praise you, O Lord my God, with all my heart; I will glorify your name for ever.
- 13 For great is your love towards me; for you have delivered me from the depth of the grave.

A few days after I had the MRI Scan done the words of James 5:14 & 15 came to mind.

- v. 14 Is any one of you sick? He should call the elders of the church to pray over him and anoint him with oil in the name of the Lord.
- v. 15 And the prayer offered in faith will make the sick person well; the Lord will raise him up.

I remember thinking, Lord why did you not bring these verses to mind before I spent all that money to get the MRI done?, but then I thought, If you had healed me before I had the MRI done nobody would have believed there was anything the matter with me.

I immediately lifted the phone and rang our minister and she said, "Right, we will do that on Wednesday night after the Prayer Meeting."

That is exactly what happened and I now want to give thanks and praise to Almighty God, because although my painkilling tablets were finished on Monday and the last pain killing patch that I had was due to be taken off on Friday, I am thankful to be able to say I didn't need any more tablets or patches.

Praise to God's holy name!

I'm now writing this on the 8th August 2016 and the healing took place on at the beginning of September 2015 and I can truthfully say I haven't had either a pain or ache in any of the areas concerned since I was prayed over on that Wednesday night.

While I am very grateful and thankful to all who agreed to pray, I say, "To God be the Glory."
